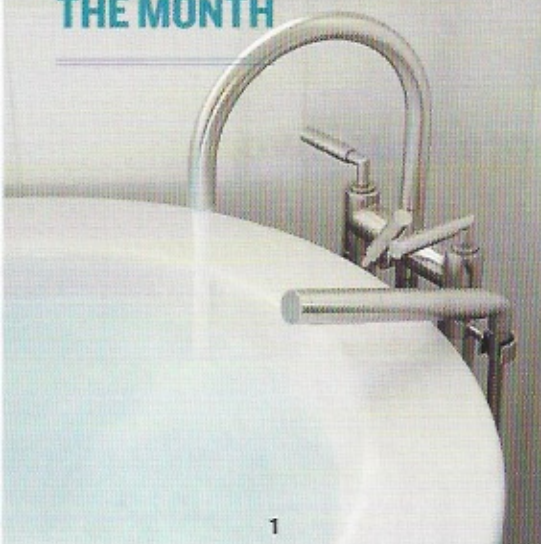

The Zen bath by Lefroy Brooks floats on wood blocks like a piece of sculpture. A floor-mounted Tara Classic faucet by Dornbracht doesn't encroach on the tub's pure lines. LEFT: One-foot-square Thassos marble tiles from Waterworks line a shower equipped with a showerhead on the wall and a rain shower on the ceiling, both by Dornbracht.

1. "Our client wouldn't let us use anything shiny, so we chose a platinum matte finish for all the Dornbracht Tara Classic faucets," Heidi Bonesteel says. "It doesn't show water spots, and it looks soft, as if it's been washed dozens of times." 2. Accessories, like this wooden tub tray from Waterworks, follow through on the simple, elemental aesthetic. 3. The Repose tiles are laid in a running bond, adding a little movement. 4. An open shelf in the vanity was sized for rolled-up towels. 5. The mirror seems to float as well, with only a beveled edge instead of a frame. The shells on the sconces add another texture and become translucent in the light. 6. More Thassos marble on the floor, in the form of four-inch hexagonal tiles from Waterworks. 7. The sink faucet is also from Dornbracht's Tara Classic line. 8. Gotham towels with custom-colored piping from Waterworks. *
